What's Up, is available on Android and iPhone for FREE (there are in-app purchases). It has a diary, a "catastrophe tracker," uplifting quotes, a game for grounding, information about thinking patterns, and a habit tracker. This app is great for teaching young people about how to cope with Depression, Anxiety, Anger, Stress and more!



MindShift is available on Android and iPhone for FREE and is focused on anxiety. MindShift is an app designed to help teens and young adults cope with anxiety. It can help you change how you think about anxiety. Rather than trying to avoid anxiety, you can make an important shift and face it.



TalkLife is available on Android and iPhone for FREE and is an app that connects teens with mental health issues and allows them to have a safe space to communicate.



Suicide Safety Plan is available on Android and iPhone for FREE and is designed to help people get through suicidal thoughts and it also has a list of emergency resources inside of it that users can tap and immediately access.
